dress up as their favourite movie star or character. However please consider the practicality of any costumes, worn through the day, including outside at break and dinner times.


Parent Governor elections

Parent Forum update

The Parent Forum reps had a steering group meeting on Monday, discussing the current key topics. Highlights include:

- Feedback from parents who have tried **school** lunches has been quite positive, although there does seem to be a general demand from parents for stronger flavours. The School Council are identifying the favourite foods with their link classes, to put these on the menu more, while appreciating a healthy balance is still needed.
- There was animated discussion on the issue of children with allergies. All systems have recently been reviewed and you will have seen in last week's newsletter, a reminder to parents to let the school know if their child becomes diagnosed with an allergy. We will be publicising more about our provision for children with allergies in the coming weeks, as all staff have undergone update training and procedures brought in line with this.
- There continues to be many complaints from local residents about KD parents parking inconsiderably, blocking driveways.
- Teachers are always aware of the potential of bullying. If you have concerns for your child, please speak in the first instance to their class teacher. It is usually possible to see them during assembly in the morning.

Friday night Kiddush

Every Friday afternoon the whole school comes together for a mock Friday evening Kiddush - the meal that brings in Shabbat (the Sabbath day).

Tomorrow is Reception's turn to help lay the table or sit and take part. All parents are warmly welcomed to join us for this assembly at 1:30pm.
