



What is "Good" attendance?

We've been so impressed with attendance recently, with an average across the school in the last two weeks of 96.2%. Hidden behind the averages, there is a range of attendance rates, with 19 children on 100% for the year so far, while in total 105 children have excellent attendance of over 97%. 41 children have Good attendance of between 95% and 97%, although this is still only about the national average. Persistent absentees are those reported to the Local Authority, with attendance of less than 90%.
