Area of Learning	Objectives
RE	This term, our focus will center on the Jewish calendar and the festivals of Tu B'Shvat, Purim, and Pesach. Through creative and engaging activities, we aim to bring these festivals to life, fostering a deeper connection to their meaning and traditions.
	Each week, we will explore themes that inspire the children to "write their own story," with a strong emphasis on leadership, self-awareness, and the development of interpersonal skills.
	The children will also delve into the concept of taking responsibility for their relationship with Hashem, exploring the importance of kavanah (intentionality) in prayers and understanding their deeper meanings. In the LK group, they will have the opportunity to pursue their own learning through independent research, encouraging curiosity and self-directed learning.





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	In addition, in LK groups Hebrew reading practice will continue to be a key focus, with homework sent home to support and strengthen their skills. This promises to be a term of growth, discovery, and meaningful engagement with our rich Jewish heritage.

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Writing	<ul> <li>This term, the children will continue working on a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. This will include:</li> <li>Third Person Stories set in another culture</li> <li>Formal letter of application</li> <li>Play Scripts - Shakespeare Retelling</li> <li>Biography</li> <li>Poems that use Word Play</li> </ul> Children will continue to practice and incorporate Year 5 spellings, grammar and punctuation into their writing.

Mathematics	In Maths, the children will be practising arithmetic, fluency, reasoning and problem-solving skills in every Maths lesson. This term, children will be learning the following topics: Multiplication and Division Fractions Decimals and Percentages Perimeter and Area Statistics
Modern Foreign Language - Ivrit	Clothes         • This term in lvrit, children will learn:         • Colours         • Clothing vocabulary         • Noun/Adjective agreement and word order, m/f singular and plural         • To use the verb ' to wear' in positive and negative form.





	<ul> <li>Prepositions (in and to)</li> <li>Connective (but)</li> <li>To express likes and dislikes</li> <li>Take part in a fashion show, describing what their peers are wearing.</li> </ul>
Science	<ul> <li>This term, our topic is Earth and Space. Children will be learning the following objectives:</li> <li>How to describe the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun in the solar system, describe the movement of the moon relative to the Earth</li> <li>How to describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies</li> <li>Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky</li> </ul>
History	In History, Children will continue to study Ancient Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world. Children will also be studying the Maya Civilisation to compare and contrast with British History.
Geography	This term, we will be focusing on map reading skills. Children will learn how to read, write, use and apply four and six figure grid references.
Design and Technology	In Design and Technology, children will be learning about road safety and how to make a road safety belt. In Textiles, children will be creating a functional and hard wearing lunch bag.





Art and Design	This term, we will be studying 3D Art. Children will develop their visual skills and look at the form of 3D objects. They will use papier-mâché as well as develop skills to manipulate clay.
Physical Education	This term, children will continue to take part in a range of physical activities. We will focus on Dance and Tennis.
Computing	This term, children will be learning about databases and how data and information is stored. We will also be learning about Programming through the use of the Crumble programming environment
Music	This term, children will be studying musical notations. Throughout the unit, pupils will deepen their understanding of standard stave notation, playing and performing from music notated on the treble stave. In the Singing unit, children will continue to develop their proficiency in part-singing by performing a song with three parts.
